

### **Parent Child Hall of Fame.**

- A Parent/Child Hall of Fame shall be established by the South Hills and Cloverleaf YMCAs effective 1/1/09.
- The Hall of Fame will recognize adults who have provided distinguished service to the parent/child programs, and children participants who have demonstrated outstanding achievements in school, athletics or the arts and who have demonstrated personal service that reflects the aims of the parent/child programs.
- The Adults will be considered based on their total combined service and leadership to one or more of the parent/child programs.
- The children will be considered based on their community service, and superior scholastic performance. Specific consideration will be given to accomplishments that reflect one or more of the following parent/child aims:
  - To be clean in body and pure in heart;
  - To be friends forever with my parent;
  - To love the sacred circle of my family;
  - To listen while others speak;
  - To love my neighbor as myself;
  - To respect the traditions and beliefs of all people; and
  - To seek and preserve the beauty of our Creator's work in forest, field and stream.
- Each year, the Hall of Fame will recognize up to 5 adults. From that group, no more than 2 shall be Current Alumni (between 1 – 3 years graduated from the parent/child programs) and 3 Senior Alumni (more than 3 years graduated from the programs). For the 2009, year, however, the Senior Alumni group shall be increased to no more than 10 inductees.
- Each year, the Hall of Fame will recognize up to 15 children as inductees. For the 2009 year, however, the number of children will be increased to 20. Children will become eligible as soon as they are no longer in the program.
- The South Hills and Cloverleaf YMCAs shall provide information to all current and historical members in January of each year about the Hall of Fame and the nominating process.
- Nominations to the Hall of Fame may be made by any current or former participant and shall be on a Form provided by the Hall of Fame Committee.
- The Hall of Fame Committee shall review each nomination and shall provide the list of nominees for selection by the Hall of Fame Voting Committee. The Hall of Fame Committee shall consist of the Current Board Chair, the Vice Chair, the

Executive Director, the current Longhouse Chiefs (including the leaders for Questors and Trailblazers) and up to two additional members as selected by the Current Board Chair.

- The Hall of Fame Voting Committee shall consist of the current Board of Directors and all of the Longhouse Chiefs of the Indian Guides and Indian Princess Programs (current and past). The Voting Committee will each select a number of individuals to be selected for the Hall of Fame as determined by the Hall of Fame Committee. An individual will be accepted to the Hall of Fame for a year if the individual receives votes from 75% or more of the Voting Committee.
- Once selected to the Parent/Child Hall of Fame, an individual shall be a permanent member of the Hall of Fame and shall receive a plaque (for adults), and medallion (children) commemorating their achievement. The adult names will also be included on a plaque hung on the Wall of Honor at the new YMCA facility.
- Each year, the Hall of Fame will host an annual Awards Banquet on Fathers' Day Weekend to recognize all inductees. The Awards Banquet will also recognize the Longhouse Chiefs, the senior Tribes, and the Tribes of the year award winners. The Awards Banquet may also recognize youth sports participants.
- The Awards Banquet will be considered a fundraising event and will provide for fundraising raffles and silent auctions. It will also be considered an opportunity to cultivate for the new facility and for the Alumni Team of the Annual Campaign.
- The Hall of Fame will host Alumni Weekend Campouts at Deer Valley and Kon-O-Kwee.
- The Hall of Fame will be formed in January, 09 and will as its first order of business take steps to identify the historical lists of Longhouse Chiefs and past participants.
